

Be Sun Smart....

- Spend less time in the sun; seek the shade
- When outdoor, cover up; use hats shoes, long pants and long sleeve shirts
- Protect your eyes with wrap around UV sun glasses
- Wear sunscreen to block UV-A and UV-B rays with an SPF (Sun Protection Factor) of at least 15
- Children's skin is more sensitive than adults' and sunburn more easily
- Babies under 1 year old should be kept out of direct sunlight.
- Avoid spending time during the peak hours of the sun, 10:00 a.m.

Steps Towards Saving Our Skies

Be an Ozone Friendly Consumer
Purchase products that are labeled "Ozone Friendly" and/or "CFC Free"

Be an Ozone Friendly Home Owner
Before disposing old refrigerators, ensure that the refrigerant gases are removed by a trained technician

Be an Ozone Friendly Farmer
If you are using methyl bromide, switch to an alternative fumigation agent.

Be an Ozone Friendly Service technician
Ensure that leaks are repaired and that refrigerant gases are not vented into the atmosphere

Be an Ozone Friendly Company
Identify areas in your company that use Ozone Depleting Substances and replace them with substances that are ozone friendly.

Be an Ozone Friendly Teacher
Teach your student about the damaging environmental effects of Ozone Depleting Substances and the steps that are being taken to protect the Ozone Layer

Expose the UV Intensity Meter to direct sunlight for 20 seconds only. Then compare the color of Ozzy with the meter bar to find the approximate range of UV intensity. Do Not Expose the UV Meter for long periods of time
